Village Treasurer/Finance Director Peterson provided a summary of the June 13, 2016 bills prelist presented for payment with the total being \$461,668.90. The total amount is based on \$175,300 for General Fund; \$121,400 for Water & Sewer Fund; \$42,500 for Retirement Fund; \$3,500 for Water & Sewer Improvement Fund; \$7,000 for Vehicle Maintenance; \$24,100 for E911 Fund; \$2,700 for Park Development Fund; and \$85,100 for the General Capital Fund.

Students Carly Acampora and Emma Sturgeon presented a request to the Village Board for consideration of constructing a skate park in the community.

Trustee McDonough asked the presenters to go over the pie chart included in the presentation. Ms. Acampora noted the pie chart presented represents percentage of injuries by sport and noted skateboarding results in significantly fewer injuries than other sports.

Mayor Brandt asked what other local communities have skate parks. Ms. Sturgeon noted Evergreen Park, Little Village, Aurora, Elgin, Buffalo Grove, Downers Grove,

Glen Ellyn, Des Plaines, and Carol Stream are some of the surrounding areas that currently have skate parks.

Trustee Hancock asked how they went about getting petitions signed. Ms. Acampora stated they collected signature at school during lunch period. Ms. Sturgeon stated the also went door-to-door in their neighborhood.

Mayor Brandt informed Ms. Acampora and Ms. Sturgeon that this type of request would typically go to staff for research, be reviewed by the Village Attorney, and then the request would go to the Park Board for review and recommendation.

Mayor Brandt noted one of the areas staff would need to review would be a location for a possible skate park and staffing.

It was the consensus of the Board to refer the request to the Park Board and requested staff research skate parks in other communities and liability issues pertaining to skate parks.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 5, CHAPTER 4
OF THE VILLAGE OF LINCOLNSHIRE**

WHEREAS, the Village of Lincolnshire (the “Village”) is an Illinois home-rule municipal corporation organized and operating under the Illinois Municipal Code and the Constitution of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Village exercises authority to adopt and enforce regulations regarding the manner in which buildings are constructed and has codified such rules in Title 5, Chapter 4 (Building Codes) of the Lincolnshire Village Code;

WHEREAS, the Village desires to amend its Building Codes and adopt by reference the published compilation of rules and regulations which have been prepared by nationally recognized technical trade or service associations, including but not limited to building codes; plumbing codes; electrical wiring codes and fire prevention codes;

WHEREAS, full and complete copies of the regulations sought to be adopted by reference in this ordinance, as more specifically described herein, have been placed on file with the Village Clerk and made available for public review and inspection for not less than thirty (30) days preceding the date of this Ordinance;

WHEREAS, an identification of the regulations sought to be adopted by this ordinance, as more specifically described herein, has been provided to the Illinois Building Commission, now known as the Illinois Capital Development Board, Division of Building Codes and Regulations, for posting on the Internet, not less than thirty (30) days preceding the date of this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lincolnshire, Lake County, Illinois, in the exercise of its home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. **Recitals.** The foregoing recitals represent the Corporate Authorities' findings of fact and shall be incorporated as though fully set forth herein.

Section 2. **Adoption of Rule.** Title 5, Chapter 4B, the "Plumbing Code," is hereby amended in the manner described below:

5-4B-3: ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS: The following provisions shall be required in addition to the provisions of the aforesaid Illinois State Plumbing Code and any future or superseding provisions or amendments of that Code.

~~A. Water Service Pipe (From water main to structure): Water service pipe must be made of type "K" copper or ductile iron pipe. When used in corrosive soil or fill, the piping material and/or protective coating or covering shall be approved by the Village Engineer or designee.~~

All new plumbing fixtures and irrigation controllers installed after the effective date of this Ordinance shall bear the WaterSense label (as designated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency WaterSense Program, or any designated successor), when such labeled fixtures are commercially available. (Ordinance _____; effective _____)

~~B. Water Distribution Piping (Pipe used above ground for potable water within the structure): The water distribution pipe shall be as follows: either type "L" copper, ductile or galvanized pipe.~~

~~C. Storm Water: On all new construction, all systems designed to handle storm water must be tied directly into a Village approved storm sewer system. If an approved storm sewer system is not available, the storm water must be directed into the rear yard or a drainage easement. It may not be directed into the street or onto an adjacent property. Although existing properties can discharge water into the street, in compliance with this code, they may not discharge storm water directly onto an adjacent property.~~

Section 3. **Penalties.** The penalty provisions described in the several international codes adopted by reference by this ordinance are not adopted by the Village. The penalty provisions described in the Comprehensive Fine/Penalty Schedule contained in Title 1, Chapter 17 of the Village Code for violations of the above-referenced codes are hereby re-adopted and affirmed with respect to the new editions of the international codes adopted hereby.

Section 4. **Reference copies.** The Village Clerk shall place at least 3 copies of the regulations adopted herein on file and make such copies available for public review and inspection.

Section 5. **Severability.** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 6. **Repealer and Effective Date.** All prior ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance be in full force and effect forthwith upon its adoption, approval and publication in the manner provided by law.

ORDINANCE 16-3407-134

**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PREVAILING WAGE RATES TO BE PAID TO
LABORERS, MECHANICS AND OTHER WORKERS PERFORMING
CONSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC WORKS FOR THE VILLAGE OF LINCOLNSHIRE**

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted the Prevailing Wage Act, approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being 820 ILCS 130/0.01 through 130/12 (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that during the month of June each calendar year the Village of Lincolnshire investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages, as defined in said Act, in the "Locality" of the Village for laborers, mechanics and other workers performing construction of public works for the Village.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lincolnshire, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: To the extent and as required by the Act, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics or other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of this Village is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Lake County as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois (the "Department"), which are in effect on June 1, 2016, or the most recently ascertainable prevailing rate of wages published by the Department, a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department shall supersede the Department's last determination and apply to all public works construction

undertaken by the Village. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in the Act shall be the same as the definition specified in the Act.

Section 2: Nothing herein is intended to apply or shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wage as herein ascertained to any work or employment performed on behalf of the Village except public works to the extent required by the Act.

Section 3: The Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the Village Hall this determination of prevailing rate of wages. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications, purchase orders, invoices or other procurement documents related to the performance of public works. The Village shall discharge its duty to notify contractors of any revised rates by inserting a written stipulation in all contracts or other written procurement instruments that states the prevailing rate of wages are revised by the Department of Labor and are available on the Department's official website.

Section 4: The Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois, but in no event later than July 15, 2016.

Section 5: Within thirty (30) days after filing a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Department of Labor, the Village Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the Village a notice that this determination is effective and constitutes the determination of this public body.

Section 6: The Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this Ordinance to any employer, to any association of employers, and to any person or association of employees, who have filed their names and addresses requesting copies of any determination stating the

particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

Section 7: If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 8: All Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 9: All Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Explanations

LAKE COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER

The grouting, cleaning, and polishing of all classes of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cement tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass,

mosaics, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walls, ceilings, swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATION TECHNICIAN

Low voltage construction, installation, maintenance and removal of telecommunication facilities (voice, sound, data and video) including outside plant, telephone, security systems and data inside wire, interconnect, terminal equipment, central offices, PABX, fiber optic cable and equipment, micro waves, V-SAT, bypass, CATV, WAN (wide area network), LAN (local area networks), and ISDN (integrated system digital network), pulling of wire in raceways, but not the installation of raceways.

MARBLE FINISHER

Loading and unloading trucks, distribution of all materials (all stone, sand, etc.), stocking of floors with material, performing all rigging for heavy work, the handling of all material that may be needed for the installation of such materials, building of scaffolding, polishing if needed, patching, waxing of material if damaged, pointing up, caulking, grouting and cleaning of marble, holding water on diamond or Carborundum blade or saw for setters cutting, use of tub saw or any other saw needed for preparation of material, drilling of holes for wires that anchor material set by setters, mixing up of molding plaster for installation of material, mixing up thin set for the installation of material, mixing up of sand to cement for the installation of material and such other work as may be required in helping a Marble Setter in the handling of all material in the erection or installation of interior marble, slate, travertine, art marble, serpentine, alberene stone, blue stone, granite and other stones (meaning as to stone any foreign or domestic materials as are specified and used in building interiors and exteriors and customarily known as stone in the trade), carrara, sanionyx, vitrolite and similar opaque glass and the laying of all marble tile, terrazzo tile, slate tile and precast tile, steps, risers treads, base, or any other materials that may be used as substitutes for any of the aforementioned materials and which are used on interior and exterior which are installed in a similar manner.

MATERIAL TESTER I: Hand coring and drilling for testing of materials; field inspection of uncured concrete and asphalt.

MATERIAL TESTER II: Field inspection of welds, structural steel, fireproofing, masonry, soil, facade, reinforcing steel, formwork, cured concrete, and concrete and asphalt batch plants; adjusting proportions of bituminous mixtures.

Five axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors 7 yards and over; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnatrailers or turnapulls when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment over 16 cubic yards; Explosives and/or Fission Material Trucks; Mixer Trucks 7 yards or over; Mobile Cranes while in transit; Oil Distributors, 1-man operation; Pole Trailer, over 40 feet; Pole and Expandable Trailers hauling material over 50 feet long; Slurry trucks, 1-man operation; Winch trucks, 3 axles or more;

Mechanic--Truck Welder and Truck Painter.

Class 4. Six axle trucks; Dual-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with hoist and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of sand, cement, marble chips, and all other materials that may be used by the Mosaic Terrazzo Mechanic, and the mixing, grinding, grouting, cleaning and sealing of all Marble, Mosaic, and Terrazzo work, floors, base, stairs, and wainscoting by hand or machine, and in addition, assisting and aiding Marble, Masonic, and Terrazzo Mechanics.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

MATERIAL TESTER & MATERIAL TESTER/INSPECTOR I AND II

Notwithstanding the difference in the classification title, the classification entitled "Material Tester I" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector I". Likewise, the classification entitled "Material Tester II" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector II".

WHEREAS, to comply with Public Act 99-0006, which amended the Act, the Village is mandated to submit a plan for the dissolution of the ETSB and entering into an intergovernmental agreement ("IGA") with certain other municipalities in order to create a joint emergency telephone system board ("JETSBS") to the Illinois State Police no later than June 30, 2016;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LINCOLNSHIRE, COUNTY OF LAKE AND STATE OF ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated hereby as if fully set forth as findings of the President and Board of Trustees.

SECTION 2. That the Village of Lincolnshire intends to comply with Public Act 99-0006 by passing an Ordinance that dissolves the ETSB upon the Commencement Date of a JETSBS that the Village will join through an IGA with certain other communities.

SECTION 3. That the Commencement Date of the JETSBS has yet to be determined, but in no case shall be later than June 30, 2017 as mandated by the Act.
