1.0 CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Borgerding called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

2.0 ROLL CALL

Superintendent Phippen called roll and determined a quorum was present.

3.0 APPROVAL OF MINUTES

3.1 Approval of the Minutes of the June 20, 2016 Meeting of the Park Board (Village of Lincolnshire)

The Park Board reviewed the minutes of the June 20, 2016 meeting. A motion was made by Ms. Siegel, seconded by Mr. Fell, to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was approved by a unanimous voice vote.

4.0 RESIDENT COMMENTS AND REQUESTS

4.1 Mr. Phippen notified the Park Board that a group of young people had attended a Village Board meeting in June and presented a petition for a skate park at North Park. The petition had over 200 signatures. After some discussion the Village Board referred the group to the Park Board, specifically the July meeting. The group was unable to attend, but plans to attend the August meeting. Information will be provided in the August Park Board packet.

6.1 Consideration and Discussion of the 10 Year Capital Budget Plan for Parks, Paths, Facilities, and Equipment (Village of Lincolnshire)

Mr. Phippen reviewed the ten year capital plan, provided spreadsheets of the proposed budgets for 2017- 2026 for consideration, and also provided a memo to the Park Board

including some of the items that came up in the July park tour.

Ms. Siegel mentioned that the ADA improvements for the path at Rivershire may be dependent on getting wheelchairs for students with wider wheels and this may be an item that could be provided by grant funding. Mr. Pippen said the ATV wheelchairs may have been needed because of the current condition of the paths. The capital improvements suggested should make the paths accessible for all types of wheelchairs. The path under consideration is only from the building to the first bridge. To do the entire path system at Rivershire would cost an estimated \$40,000. The cost for the part of the path suggested would cost between \$6,000 and \$9,000 depending on the material used. Limestone screening is less expensive than the red rotten granite.

Ms. Siegel mentioned the possibility of a grant for the path. Mr. Fell said that with a grant you may spend more money in engineering and design costs than you might pay just doing the path. Village staff can investigate the options. The School District could be approached regarding sharing the cost. Mr. Pippen suggested putting the project out a year to give the Village and School District an opportunity to explore options. Mr. Fell suggested presenting the option of the improvement for the entire path system when discussing the cost sharing with the School District. Mr. Pippen noted that the path improvements would not be only for disabled students but would make the paths accessible for anyone who wanted to use them. Maintenance of this kind of path includes annual top-dressing and more complete maintenance about every three years. In case of a flood there would have to be a major repair but it would be covered by insurance. Mr. Fell would like to have the suggested budget item be for the entire path.

The second ramp considered for the Rivershire Nature Center would allow children in wheelchairs to exit the building in the same place as the other children providing full inclusion.

Regarding the lacrosse practice wall, Mr. Campbell asked for more information about what it involves and what different options could be. Mr. Pippen said that the photo included in the Park Board packet showed a ball wall at the basketball court at Balzer Park but it could be located at another park. The product recommended is a composite product, not wood or fiberglass, which should handle the impact of the hard lacrosse balls. The sizes available range from 8'x10' to 24'x10'. Ten foot is the maximum height, which is the height of the fence at Balzer Park. Ms. Siegel suggested the tennis court since the basketball court is used all the time.

The prices provided in the memo are based on size, and range from \$4,000 for the smallest to \$8,000 for the largest including shipping. The walls can also be used for pitching or tennis practice or any other similar practice use. Regarding location, the walls are designed for tennis practice and would be most secure attached to a fence. It could be installed at any of the Village's tennis courts. Mr. Campbell noted that the last time the Village considered installing a ball wall at North Park it was a concrete block wall requiring a foundation which was going to cost over ten times the amount of this type of wall. Chairman Borgerding suggested putting one at Spring Lake Park and one at Balzer Park at the tennis courts.

Mr. Pippen said the issue came up because a young man was practicing at the Spring

Lake wooden practice ball wall and because it was wooden he was putting holes in it. The young man came to the Park Board and said he didn't intend to damage the wall and he would appreciate a place to practice lacrosse. Balzer was suggested because new fencing is budgeted for next year. The Park Board concurred that one ball wall to start is a good idea and they would like to try the 10' x 20' size.

The split rail fence replacement at Rivershire Park is budgeted in 2020 at an estimated current cost of \$17,000 for approximately 1,550ft of fence. At the last Park Board meeting-tour Ms. Lin said the fence is falling apart and will probably need replacement before 2020. The fence replacement project could either be moved up to next year, or we could remove the broken parts and leave it in the budget for future replacement. Ms. Siegel said it was in pretty bad shape and Mr. Baynon noted that at the last flood we lost a lot of fence rails and posts. Mr. Fell asked if a new fence would be installed differently or would it be subject to the same flood damage. Mr. Baynon said that the same style of fence would be subject to the same type of damage depending on water height and current. The fence is more vulnerable to damage as it ages. Staff recommends moving the project up since the existing broken down fence is no longer serving its purpose of marking the paths and is unattractive. The existing fence is probably 15-20 years old. Mr. Fell recommended moving the project up to 2017 and the other members present agree.

Mr. Phippen noted that the four picnic tables requested to be moved up to 2017 are a result of a resident request. Staff moved the existing tables around, however the Spring Lake Park picnic areas are in need of more tables. Staff also investigated providing larger trash cans. The Waste Management large solar compactor trash collectors are \$5,000 per set. These would probably not be warranted if the lifeguards are able to collect trash more frequently. The existing trash containers can't be moved down closer to the beach because it is too shady for the solar collectors to work. The solar collectors in use were provided at no cost to the Village by Waste Management as a demonstration of a new product. The Park Board agreed to add the request for additional tables to the 2017 budget.

A motion was made by Mr. Fell, seconded by Mr. Campbell as follows:

"The Park Board recommends approval of the proposed 10 Year Capital Plan for Parks, Paths, Facilities and Equipment as presented by staff and amended to include the Park Board project requests for a lacrosse wall at Balzer Park, fence replacement at Rivershire Park, and four additional picnic tables at Spring Lake Park in 2017; and conversion of the chipped paths at Rivershire Park to an ADA accessible surface and construction of a second ADA accessible ramp from the Nature Center in 2018 pending Village discussions with School District #103 and research of grant options for shared funding of the path conversion and ramp construction."

The motion was approved by unanimous voice vote.

Subject: Consideration, Discussion and Recommendation to the Village Board Residents Request for a Skate Park at North Park (Village of Lincolnshire)

Action Requested: Recommendation to Village Board

Summary / Background: At the June 13th 2016, Village Board Committee of the Whole meeting, residents Carly Acampora and Emma Sturgeon presented a request for the Village to construct a Skate Park at North Park. After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to refer the request to the Park Board and requested staff research skate parks in other communities and liability issues pertaining to skate parks. The residents will be in attendance at the August 15th Park Board meeting to request the project be considered, and present supporting information they have gathered in addition to the attachment provided.

The concept of a skate park at North Park was discussed during the planning process for the park in 1999 at a joint meeting of the Park Board and the Recreational Facilities and Open Space Committee held Tuesday, October 19, 1999. The minutes from the meeting are attached.

Staff has contacted Vernon Hills, Buffalo Grove, Lake in the Hills, and Des Plaines to discuss liabilities and costs associated with these types of facilities. The result of our research is as follows:

- **Costs** - Ranging from \$286,000.00 to \$600,000.00 for construction depending on size and equipment. Minimal costs for maintenance, however all sites are checked and cleaned daily.
- **Staffing:** None of the facilities had staff assigned specifically to the skate park, but Des Plaines and Vernon Hills have full time staff at the facilities that include the skate parks.
- **Liability:** All of the agencies contacted were consistent with this issue. All had sought counsel from the Park District Risk Management Agency (PDRMA), the pool insurer for most park districts in Illinois. PDRMA has advised that as long as rules are clearly posted and contain a "skate at your own risk" type statement, the agency is covered against any liability arising from injuries that may occur from use of the facility. Examples of each agencies rules are attached.

Staff is requesting the Park Board to review and recommend to the Village Board whether to include the requested facility in a future budget, and if so, what year would the Park Board request the facility be constructed.

Budget Impact: There are currently no funds allocated in the Village's 10 year Capital Budget Plan for this facility. Adding this project may lead to deferring other projects and/or equipment replacements conditional on projected revenue for the requested year.


Recommendation: Staff has no recommendation for this project at this time, but is prepared to discuss how and where the request may be implemented at the August Park Board meeting.

The skatepark can also be a fun place to hangout or play. There are many people in our neighborhood that ride around that look for a fun place to do tricks or just ride for fun.


In summary, here are some reasons having a skate park would benefit the village of Lincolnshire:

5. This skate park is open and closed the same times at North Park.

7. No food or drinks allowed in or around skate park. No glass containers.
8. **No Smoking**. Alcohol, tobacco products, drugs, or weapons of any kind are strictly prohibited.
9. Do not skate if hazardous conditions exist. No skating when surface is wet.
10. No motorized vehicles allowed in skate park
11. Spectators are to remain outside of skate park.

1.0 Call to Order

Chairman O'Brien, called the meeting to order.

2.0 Role was called and it was determined a quorum was present.

3.0 Review of Minutes from Park Board Meeting held, Thursday, September 23 1999 was conducted and a motion was made by Mr. Pyster, seconded by Mr. Lipton to amend the minutes by adding, under Absent: Mary Batsford. This motion was approved by unanimous voice vote.

4.0 Residents Comments and Concerns

4.1 Mrs. Chris Dennison came to request the Park Board's consideration of an in-line skating facility for the children in the Village. Mrs. Dennison's son expressed his interest and the interest of 200 other kids at Daniel Wright. They stated they understand there may not be space available at the new park site but perhaps a location in an other park might be suitable.

Mr. Lipton stated that Spring Lake Sports League needed the available space at the new park site and that the Park Board could certainly look into other locations, however, previous discussions regarding skating facilities had encouraged participants to look to outside sources to base and supervise the activity. Chairman O'Brien stated that prior Park Board discussions had recommended that the skaters form an organization similar to SLSL. This organization would supervise and handle the insurance issues. It has been the recommendation of the Village Attorney that any facility be supervised. Staff stated Balzer Park is scheduled to be resurfaced and at one time use of a Sport Court surface had been discussed. This surface allows for skating which does not destroy the surface of the tennis courts.

Sue Breckheimer, 14 Portshire Drive, arrived late but requested the Board consideration of a skate facility for the children. She stated that it was unfair to restrict development of such a facility based on situations outside our community.

4.2 Beth Grossman, 303 Carlisle, expressed interest in getting an ice skating facility at Whytegate Park. She has contacted 80% - 90% of the residents around the park and they have been agreeable to a lighted skate facility in the park.

Wendy George, 311 Surrey, also expressed interest in a skating facility at Whytegate Park.

Mike Suerth, Windsor Drive, also expressed support for an ice skating facility.

Staff will meet with these two residents at Whytegate Park and will provide a report at the next Park Board Meeting.

5.0 Presentation from the Recreational Facilities and Open Space Committee for the new park.

J.J.R. appears to be clear on the objectives. They will present three alternatives and requested information as to what the Village Board will expect. They requested that the Park Board settle on the numbers and layout of the park amenities. Ms. Maine requested, if possible that J.J.R. provide a rough estimate as to the cost of the project. Mr. Campbell expressed concern over the layout of the fast pitch ball fields.

Ms. Schroeder requested that Concept B show the ice skating closer to the restrooms and that the micro fields be moved to the south to provide easier access by parents with small children.

Ms. Batsford wanted to know the position of the Committee regarding the proposed fire

station. It had been the Committee's recommendation that no fire station be placed on the site.

Staff stated that Mr. Byers from the Illinois Nature Preserve had been contacted and that a path system through the new park natural area could be wide enough to support maintenance equipment, cross skiing and walking. The Nature Preserve Buffer would provide for picnicking.

Chairman O'Brien asked if the open space in the woodland would be available for frisbee, catch, etc. Mr. Godshalk stated that it was important to consider the understory and that other people have interests other than sports.

Ms. Love asked if the parking area could be made to look less institutional. Mr. Boyle stated that this was simply a schematic and that there are islands planned for the parking area which will help to break it up and improve its appearance. Ms. Love stated that the Botanic Gardens has had difficulty getting things to grow in their islands and that care should be taken to provide enough space and the property materials.

Mr. Batsford, made a motion to amend the concept drawing as discussed. This motion was accepted by Mr. Godshalk. The motion was accepted by unanimous voice vote.

Mr. Lipton made a motion to accept the plan as presented, the motion was seconded by Mr. Campbell. The motion was accepted by unanimous voice vote.

The Park Board discussed the possible need for a facility to handle recreational programming. With the expansion of teen and senior programming this may be an issue which needs consideration in the future.

Chairman O'Brien, called the meeting to order.

2.0 Role was called and it was determined a quorum was present.

3.0 Resident Comments

Wendy George, 311 Surrey Lane, stated she believes it would be tremendous benefit to the Village and provide year around use of the park.

Mr. Dale Gordon, 303 Surrey is in favor of skating at the park with the following items taken into account:

- lighting will cause light pollution and draw people into the park. Care should be taken, if lighting is provided, to point it away from the homes
- traffic will increase, cars will be parked down the streets. Consideration should be given on safety issues
- noise is going to increase. There is also a safety issue mixing hockey and pleasure skating. Care should be taken to alternate use
- the size of the rink seems small for the number of kids who will probably want to use it.

Chairman O'Brien asked if this site were considered to be a local or community park. Mr. Gordon stated it was a local park. Mr. O'Brien asked if the park were open to 9:30 or 10:00 p.m. would this be an issue? Mr. Gordon stated it would be too late.

Beth Grossman, 303 Carlisle, requested that consideration be given to restrict the parking to one side of the street and that curfews should be established.

Mr. O'Brien stated that he had discussions with Ms. Schroeder earlier in the day and that it had been suggested the Village consider a partnership with Sprague School or use Rivershire Park. He asked how Mrs. Grossman felt about that facility. She stated she would like to see the skate rink at Whytegate Park and if use turned out to be significant perhaps it would be better to look into a larger site.

Mr. John Galassini, 311 Whytegate stated he was excited about a facility but recommended that consideration be given to providing a guard, limit the hours of use, providing a warming facility and stagger the usage.

Staff reported that they had investigated a rink which would consist of a prefabricated liner inside a wooden frame and topped with a bumper and edge protector. The size recommended would be 80 ft. by 135 ft. Additionally, temporary lighting could be installed. A 27 ft. pole holding two 400 watt halogen bulbs with baffle and a timer would be recommended. Lighting would be directed onto the ice toward Riverwoods Road. Finally, funding could be obtained by putting off installation of the basketball court at Olde Mill Park until a subsequent year.

4.0 Old Business

Whytegate Park Ice Skating Rink

Chairman O'Brien requested the Park Board opinions on the resident comments and staff proposal.

Ms. Love is opposed to using Whytegate Park because of lighting and parking issues which have not been resolved satisfactorily.

Ms. Schroeder is opposed to using Whytegate Park because the rink will likely be too small to safely accommodate the high number of users. She would support alternative sites with warming house features.

Ms. Batsford recommended that the police department increase their visitation of the park, check for loitering and review safety issues regarding overflow parking along the streets.

Mr. Campbell stated that we should not postpone the rink. It should be done now. A review of the situation should be conducted and he hopes people have a great time.

Mr. Pyster stated that he looks forward to seeing the rink done. It takes too long to get things accomplished here.

Mr. Lipton stated that we should do it. It may provide further justification for more skating at North Park.

Mr. Phippen stated that if the Park Board want to do it, staff will see that it happens. He is excited about it. Staff will contact the police department and recommend that the police check at the change over times to see if there are any problems.

Chairman O'Brien stated that the recommendation should be clear that this is not a perfect situation. There are concerns about parking and the police will be requested to look into that issue. It was determined that the rink would be utilized in the following manner:

Monday, Wednesday, Friday	Figure Skating
Tuesday and Thursday	Hockey
Saturday and Sunday to 1:00 p.m.	Hockey

Location of the park entrance has been shifted to the easement because of Lake County requirements and increased costs associated with intersection improvements.

6.0 Staff regretfully discussed the resignation of Julie Stephenson. Executive Services for the Village is advertising for the position and it is hoped it will be filled soon.

The Park Board discussed and recommended by unanimous vote a program for growing orchids in your home. This recommendation will be forwarded to the Village Board for approval.

Staff presented a year end summary of recreational programs. The Park Board requested previous years summary to provide some comparison. Staff will provide that information in next month's packet.

7.0 Old Business

Balzer Park Lighting

No residents were present at the meeting to discuss this issue. Staff reported that she had received two calls from residents. One stating the orientation of the courts needs to be changed prior to considering any lighting. Another resident expressed that there was no need to providing lighting because it was light late into the evening in the summer months.

Staff reported that approximately fifty homes were notified of the meeting — homes around Balzer Park and most likely to be effected.

The Park Board recommended that lights be provided at Balzer Park, when this project came up for completion as allowed in the budget process. Information should be provided to the Village Board indicating that residents were contacted, the number of responses received, recommendation that the lights be activated by a button so when the courts are not in use the lights will be out. Lights will comply with Village code requirements so as not to disturb residents around the park. Additionally, lights should be considered for the playground.

It was also recommended that residents be contacted again when the issue came up in the budget. This would be due to the fact that new residents may have moved in.

8.0 New Business

Staff informed the Park Board that the Illinois Nature Preserves would be attending the next Park Board meeting to make a presentation and to address any questions from the Board regarding dedication of all or part of North Park natural area.



Skate Parks



Locations

The Village operates two skate parks, Richard Taylor Skate Park 1107 Crystal Lake Rd. and Sunset Skate Park corner of Miller and Haligus Rd.

Hours

Skate parks are open from 9:00 a.m. until dusk daily. Village skate parks will be closed approximately October 1 through April 1 with said date of opening / closing to be determined by the Parks and Recreation Department based on environmental and usage factors. Ramps will be closed when wet or after rain as determined necessary by the Parks and Recreation Department.

Rules and Regulations

- Skateboards, bicycles, and in-line skates are allowed in the same area of the skate parks.
- Motorized vehicles and scooters are prohibited within the designated skating area.
- Only those individuals with skates, bicycles, or skateboards are allowed in the skate park boundaries.
- Spectators are not allowed on equipment.
- Personally owned ramps, half pipes or similar devices are prohibited.
- Profanity and/or other language, offensive behavior or conduct that alarms or disturbs another individual is prohibited.

- Reckless behavior that places the individual or other parties present at risk of harm is prohibited.
- Graffiti, defacement or any other form of criminal damage to property is prohibited.
- Backpacks, food and drink are allowed only in the picnic table areas outside the skate park fence.
- Smoking is prohibited within 15 feet of the facility.
- Glass is prohibited within or upon the facility.

CAUTION skateboarding and in-line skating activities are high-risk recreational activities with inherent risks of serious injury. This facility is unsupervised and participants skate at their own risk. It is strongly recommended that all participants wear proper protective equipment.
