## Summer Infrastructure Improvements Planned

As part of the annual budget process, Village Trustees work with staff to create a Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to be executed throughout the year. Projects are meant to address pressing infrastructure needs as well as anticipate future issues. The Village's 2014 CIP is well underway, with roughly \$3.2 million in infrastructure improvements planned. This year's projects are part of a comprehensive 5 year CIP based on expected life of infrastructure; replacement schedules; planned improvements; and other factors necessitating capital work in the Village. The use of a 5 year CIP allows the Village to reduce the likelihood of expensive emergency repairs; take advantage of partnerships with other governmental agencies and responsibly budget for the future needs of the Village.

# Infrastructure Improvements (Continued from Page 1)

Below is a summary of major 2014 CIP projects:

## Road Rehabilitation Project

Annually staff perform an assessment of roadway conditions throughout the Village to identify repair and preventative maintenance needs. Along with normal wear and tear, the extreme winter season took a significant toll on Village roads. Streets targeted for rehabilitation this year are: Dukes Lane, Dukes Circle, Dukes Court, and Brunswick Lane. This work primarily involves removal of worn and damaged road surfaces and replacement with new asphalt. Additionally, some curb repairs and drainage improvements will be completed as part of the project. The work is funded partially by Village General Capital Funds and Motor Fuel Tax Funds. Several other locations in the Village will receive minor preventive maintenance to prolong the life of Village roadways. ## Riverwoods Road Resurfacing

The Lake County Department of Transportation (LCDOT) plans to resurface a section of Riverwoods Road from Route 60 to Route 22 in the Village. The Village discussed the project extensively with LCDOT to ensure the work schedule does not interfere with Village events or the Daniel Wright Junior High summer school schedule. Affected residents will be notified of street closures, and updates on the project will be available through the Village's communication tools, such as the Village of Lincolnshire website and weekly E-News blasts.

## Additional Street Patching

The 2014 budget included \$25,000 for pavement patching for various locations throughout the Village. However, the recent harsh winter caused significantly more damage than an average winter season. As a result, the Village Board authorized an additional \$55,000 in funding to address a greater percentage of patching needs throughout the Village. Patching will occur throughout the summer months.

## Water Main Replacements

Engineering design work for replacement of two sections of water mains is planned for this year. Construction of the projects will not take place until 2015. This year, engineering design and bid document preparation for projects at Riverwoods Road and Fox Trail and Westwood Lane, Middlebury Lane, and Bedford Court will be completed. In an effort to lower costs and reduce inconvenience to residents, both projects will be bid together and staff anticipates construction starting in the spring of 2015.

## Milwaukee Avenue and Old Half Day Road Pedestrian Signal Improvements

The 2014 Budget includes a project to provide improved pedestrian safety when crossing Route 21 at Old Half Day Road. Work includes curb replacement, pedestrian countdown signals, and pavement markings. The project will result in a code compliant, safe passage along the north and west legs of the intersection. Work is anticipated to begin in July or August.

## School's – Out – For – Summer!

School may be out, but curfew laws still apply to youths under the age of 17 during the summer months. Some municipalities adopt stricter curfew regulations than state statute requires. The Lincolnshire Police Department encourages you to phone ahead to a specific town or check its website if you have curfew-related questions. The Village of Lincolnshire's ordinance follows current state law.

The hours of curfew are:

12:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday

11:00 p.m. on Sunday to Thursday

Under the Village of Lincolnshire's ordinance, there is also a section related to parental responsibility, which prohibits parents or legal guardians to knowingly permit a person in his/her custody to violate any provisions of the curfew limitations. ### Spraying for Mosquitoes

Clarke Environmental Mosquito monitors the mosquito population and sprays the entire Village when appropriate to control this nuisance. If you prefer Clarke notify you several hours before spraying, so you may close your windows, please call Clarke Notification Service at 800-942-2555. Residents can also use this hot line to report standing water or to be placed on its Night Spraying Prior Notification list.



### SUMMERTIME SAFETY

After the record-breaking winter of 2013-2014, most of us are welcoming the idea of a long, hot summer. As we start to enjoy the warm air, keep in mind heat can bring on heatstroke. Sadly, heatstroke is the leading cause of non-crash, vehicle-related deaths for children. While it may seem harmless to leave a sleeping baby alone in his or her car seat while we quickly run an errand, leaving a child alone even for a short period of time can lead to serious injury or death from heatstroke. On average, a child dies from heatstroke in a vehicle every 10 days. Young children are particularly at risk, as their bodies' heat up three to five times faster than an adult. Take action! ### Village Offers Tree Removal Permit Application Online

Applying for a Tree Removal Permit is now more convenient than ever. The Village of Lincolnshire offers a downloadable tree removal application. The benefits include faster permitting and a simplified application process.

The Tree Removal Application can be found on the Village's website [www.village.lincolnshire.il.us](http://www.village.lincolnshire.il.us) under the Applications, Permits, and Policies section.

This application **does not** take the place of a tree removal permit. Commercial and building related tree removals are required to follow procedures under section 13-1-4 of the Lincolnshire Tree Preservation code. The Village reviews the application and renders a decision within ten (10) working days of receipt of a properly completed permit application. ### Summer Water Restrictions

Outside water usage is restricted in the Village between May 15th and September 15th. Outside water usage includes water used for lawn and garden irrigation and washing of vehicles. If your address ends in an even number, you may use outside water on even calendar days. Similarly, if your address ends in an odd number, you may use outside water on odd calendar days. Communities bordering Lake Michigan are restricted in the amount of water withdrawn from the lake. As a result, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Division of Water Resources, requires communities take measures to conserve water. Outside water use restrictions are implemented by communities as one such conservation effort.
