2016 Village Work Plan

As part of the annual budget process, the Lincolnshire Village Board discusses capital projects as well as general Village goals for the upcoming year. These goals and capital projects not only address needed infrastructure throughout the Village, but go beyond to make our Village a more beautiful, safer, and more attractive place to live and work.

The Village's capital plan primarily addresses improvements and repairs of the Village's streets, water and sewer systems, and other aspects of the Village's infrastructure. To meet the Village's goals for fiscal stability and the highest level of customer service, the Village Board and staff incorporate 10 years of planned projects into the capital plan. A long term plan allows for less inconvenience to residents due to construction, better planning, and provides for the opportunity to work with neighboring municipalities and counties to leverage economies of scale when purchasing materials and contracting for labor. The 10-Year Capital Plan is published in the annual budget, and is available on the Village website at www.lincolnshireil.gov. The 2016 Capital Plan includes more than \$4 million dollars of projects ranging from water main repairs to addressing forestry needs of the Village. Examples of

major capital projects to be executed in 2016 include:

- Replacement of the Village Hall roof
- Continued work on the Des Plaines River Bank Stabilization Project
- Final phase of the automated meter rollout
- Blazer Park tennis court improvements (fence repair)
- Road resurfacing on Robinhood Court, Friar Tuck Court, and Berkshire Lane
- Pocket park construction in the downtown area
- Half Day Road beautification (Federal Grant)

In addition to the 10-Year Capital Plan, the Village Board approves goals and objectives annually, along with the budget. These goals focus less on infrastructure, and more on enhancing Village services to residents, and improvements for operational efficiency. The Village Board identified 49 Village goals for 2016, including:

- Central Area Plan: Prepare a multi-faceted Master Plan for the Village's primary commercial artery; Milwaukee Avenue and immediate areas.
- Research and Recommend Approach for Developing Village of Lincolnshire Strategic Plan: Explore potential consultants/firms to work with residents, Village staff and elected officials on creation of a Lincolnshire strategic plan. The planning process will explore community strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, threats, and build an action plan to address long-term Village needs.
- Emergency Planning: Continue comprehensive review and update of Village Disaster Preparedness Plan. Evaluate best location for Emergency Operations Center and prepare site to fulfill function. Conduct staff training on utilization of plan as needed.

As with the 10-Year Capital Plan, the Village goals and objectives for 2016 are published in the annual budget and are available on the Village website at www.lincolnshireil.gov.

Capital Improvements Underway

Hydrant Flushing/Clearing

The Village Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants throughout the Water System in April. Flushing will be done intermittently from 10:00 p.m. - 6:30 a.m., April 3 - 7, April 10 - 14, and April 17 - 21. Please refrain from washing laundry during these hours as clothing could become stained. Additionally, the Village requests assistance in keeping a 48-inch clearance around all fire hydrants to comply with the Illinois Fire Hydrant Act (425ILCS 20/1). Please clear barriers including trees or bushes, or other obstacles which hide or impede the use of the hydrant. 2016 Road Resurfacing Improvements

The Village of Lincolnshire will continue to show its commitment towards road rehabilitation by conducting road resurfacing in the southeast area of the Village in 2016. The following streets are scheduled for resurfacing: Berkshire Lane, Robinhood Court, Friar Tuck Lane, and Sherwood Drive. These areas will see a complete resurfacing of pavement, along with limited curb removal and replacement. This project is expected to start early-summer and be completed prior to start of school. Apply for a Permit in your Pajamas!



The Village is excited to announce a fast and easy way for residents to report issues or make requests to the Village. The new system, known as **AccessMyGov**, is a one-stop resource for residents to take advantage of the most commonly requested services provided by the Village; all from the comfort of your home. Using a simple link on the Village's website, residents can notify the Village of issues such as standing water, downed trees, or property maintenance

concerns. Residents can also check on the status of requests by creating an account.

AccessMyGov also offers contractors and residents an opportunity to schedule and manage inspections for construction occurring in the Village. The online inspection system expedites the process and simplifies following up on inspections. The system also gives residents a view into the progress of their construction projects managed by their contractor. By using AccessMyGov, you have up to the minute information on the status of building permits, results of inspections, and other aspects of the building process.

In addition to online service requests, the AccessMyGov website will be expanded in the upcoming months to include features such as online permit applications and water and sewer bill pay. You can skip waiting in line, applying for simple permits such as garage sale or paying your water bill can be done instantly from your home.
