Medline Industries and CDW Invest in Lincolnshire



The Village of Lincolnshire is pleased to welcome the newest additions to our growing base of major national corporate offices, Medline Industries and CDW. Both Medline and CDW recently selected Lincolnshire as the preferred location for expansion and future growth. On January 28, 2015, Medline Industries announced acquisition of the former Aon Hewitt office campus at 90-100 Half Day Road in Lincolnshire. The property has remained largely vacant since 2013 when Aon moved its office operations to Lincolnshire's 4 Overlook Point. Medline, currently based in Mundelein, Illinois, is a manufacturer and distributor of health care supplies. The 40-acre campus, purchased by Medline consists of 269,000-square-feet of office space. Medline plans to complete interior renovations of an existing building this summer, with occupancy expected later in 2015. The Lincolnshire property is expected to accommodate Medline's future growth, and at the same time redevelop (one of the most high-profile properties) in the Village.



On February 11, 2015, CDW, a Fortune 500 technology company, announced the lease of 25 and 75 Tri-State International, encompassing 209,000-square-feet in Lincolnshire's Tri-State International Office Center. These two currently vacant buildings will soon be bustling with several hundred employees, relocating from Mettawa and Vernon Hills, in a move to consolidate operations and improve efficiencies. In November, 2014, the Village approved construction of a new 4-story parking deck to accommodate CDW employees'. Interior renovations and parking deck construction are scheduled to begin late spring, with occupancy anticipated at the end of 2015.

The Village has worked closely with representatives of both companies during the due diligence and site selection process. "Lincolnshire is very pleased with Medline and CDW's decisions to make a significant investment in Lincolnshire and looks forward to further assisting the companies as they establish their operations in the Village. Their decisions to locate in Lincolnshire affirm the Village as the premier location in Lake County for major corporate offices and headquarters," stated Lincolnshire Mayor Brett Blomberg. Lincolnshire

continues to be a prime destination for business location and expansion, due to the Village's enviable access to transportation, amenities, and positive business climate. The Village boasts more than 25 restaurants, 6 hotels, a movie theater and other quality amenities valued by corporations. Medline and CDW join a premier community of established corporate headquarters in Lincolnshire, including Aon Hewitt, Sysmex, Zebra Technologies, Klein Tools, Interior Investments and Kubota Engine America.



Lincolnshire's Brand Development and Marketing Initiative

PUBLIC WORKS

2015 Water Main Replacement Project

This spring, the water main serving residents on Westwood Lane, Middlebury Lane and Bedford Court will be replaced. An evaluation has shown corrosive soil conditions contributed to a large number of breaks in these areas over the past several years. New installation practices and protective pipe materials will be used to address the corrosive soil issue. This project (anticipated to start in April and run through July) includes roadway renovation and is estimated to take three months for completion. Hydrant Flushing/Clearing

The Village Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants throughout the Village in April. Flushing will be done intermittently from 10:00 p.m. - 6:30 a.m., April 5th–April 23rd. Please refrain from washing laundry during these hours as clothing could become stained. Additionally, the Village requests assistance in keeping a 48-inch clearance around all fire hydrants in order to comply with the Illinois Fire Hydrant Act (425ILCS 20/1). Please clear any barriers including trees, bushes, or other obstacles which hide or impede the use of the hydrants. Emerald Ash Borer Treatments

The Village has obtained pricing for treatment of ash trees. This pricing is available to residents who would like to treat ash trees on their property. This treatment has proven to be effective in certain circumstances. It is administered via injection and must be completed every two years. Are you being smart with your smartphone?

A cellphone, specifically a smartphone, can do so much these days. There is a cellphone application for GPS, online banking, email, insurance information, and health applications. These applications are useful for daily functions and make it easier and quicker to complete tasks. However, these applications make your cellphone a database of personal information. Your smartphone is a great target for identity theft. Here are some tips on how to protect your smartphone:



1. **Set your phone to lock automatically and use a password to unlock your phone** - When your phone is not in use after several minutes, the smartphone should automatically lock and require a password.
2. **Protect sensitive data** - Do not text or email personal information. When using the Internet on your smartphone, ensure the web address is secure before providing personal information. Also, be careful of pseudo-applications which may steal your login and personal information.
3. **Watch your wireless and Bluetooth** - Hackers are able to remotely access a smartphone via a Bluetooth connection and then access data and browse the Internet. To help prevent this from happening, it is important to ensure your Bluetooth device is non-discoverable and to decline all unknown Bluetooth connection requests. As for wireless Internet, turn off your wireless connection when you are not using it, and use caution when connecting to wireless hotspots and unknown networks.
4. **Use caution with applications** - When downloading applications, it is important to pay attention to the requirements and permissions being requested by the application. The demands for the application being downloaded should be realistic.
5. **Rooting your phone is not recommended** - Rooting your cellphone, also known as *jailbreaking*, allows users to access read-only files and to access the operating system. Rooting is usually done by users who are aware of the potential dangers. Rooting your smartphone creates a greater potential for malware to be maliciously installed, and the malware could allow full access to your device. For example, malware can record keystrokes entered using the on-screen keyboard, install pseudo-applications, access files, and copy data.
6. **Increase security on your smartphone** - When an update is needed on your smartphone's operating system, these updates should be installed as soon as possible because these updates may be essential to patching prior security flaws. Furthermore, because your smartphone has nearly the same computing power as your personal computer, a smartphone can benefit from a mobile security application. Not only do mobile security applications protect against mobile malware but also can provide several anti-theft features.

Spring Cleanup – Saturday, April 11th



On Saturday, April 11, 2015, residents may put out household goods for pick up. Collection does **not** include “white goods” (appliances), household chemical waste and landscape waste. Items such as carpeting or lumber must be bundled in lengths not more than 4’ long and 2’ in diameter. All items must be able to be lifted by one person. All goods must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the morning of the pickup. Residents may begin placing items at the curb after 7:00 p.m. the night before.
